- Be proactive in the maintenance of our building and grounds


Get more engaged in Baltimore and the Diocese

- Become more outward facing and outward focused
- Explore new mission initiatives
- Embrace our role as a flagship parish of the diocese



Open up our building and our green space

- Develop our property to invite others in
- Develop stronger relationships with our neighbors
- Leverage our position as a crossroads of several neighborhoods
- Get the word out about all that we are doing





Do more long-term planning

- Develop a master plan to make our building and grounds more welcoming, inviting, and accessible
- Evaluate our current outreach programs and develop criteria for future endeavors
- Create a seed fund to help expand our justice and outreach initiatives



Be proactive in the maintenance of our building and grounds

- Repair water damage in the sanctuary
- Develop a spiritual pathway through the property
- Clean up the Saint Paul St.
 side of the property
- Do more to protect the watershed from water run off





Four specific goals have emerged that we think will be transformational.

Create a seed fund for mission initiatives 10% of total raised

The Cathedral community is committed to justice and outreach. There are many ways we want to do more but we haven't had the funds to expand our reach.



Repair, repaint and enhance the sanctuary \$300,000 to \$500,000

 Repair plaster and clean stonework, remove old speakers and unused wiring
 Repaint with a new color scheme to highlight

architectural elements





Open up our green space for meditation and education about creation \$450,000 to \$600,000

 Build paths throughout our 11 acre property with places for meditation and education
 Clean up the Saint Paul St. side of the property and address issues of erosion and invasive species

- Create a garden maintenance fund
- Add additional parking





Rework cathedral entrances to be more welcoming and functional \$250,000 to \$450,000

Convert the traffic circle into a reception court. Create an exterior walkway that connects the office wing and the southwest entrance Install a new rain garden to accept rain water from our roof


Summary of Goals

- Create a seed fund for mission initiatives
 10% of total raised
- Repair, repaint and enhance the sanctuary
 \$300,000 to \$500,000
- Open up our green space for meditation and education about creation
 \$450,000 to \$600,000
- Rework cathedral entrances to be more welcoming and functional \$250,000 to \$450,000

There are ranges of costs for each because we plan to only spend the amount of money we raise

Achieving our goals will require more funds than our annual pledging can support so the Chapter has decided to undertake a capital campaign

Annual Giving



Our annual pledges support our budget. For 2019 pledges increased by \$25,000 and we reduced our spending by \$30,000.

Capital Campaign

Giving to a capital campaign differs from annual pledging which typically comes from your regular income

Why do we need to do this now?

- We have an urgent need to repair water damage in the Cathedral
- We want to build on growth we have achieved through engagement of young families and commitment to outreach
- We have renewed energy and we feel we are ready to take the next step

Can we achieve our goals?

The Cathedral last undertook a special project of this size when we built the Peace Chapel over twenty years ago.

Churches like ours can typically raise three times our annual giving. Could you consider doing that?

This is an ambitious project but with broad support we can Open Doors <u>and</u> Open Hearts.
