

## Letter from the Pastor

### **Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,**

I am thinking of you and praying for you daily as we all do our best to stay far away from the Covid -19 Coronavirus. I trust that we are all staying home as much as possible, and utilizing best practices such as frequent hand-washing with soap and water, compassionate distancing if we need to go out, and remembering to **Stay Calm**, **Stay Connected and Stay Church**. Those last two are essential as social isolation can cause undo stress which in turn makes us more susceptible to infection. **If you are able, do Stay Connected and Stay Church through our Live Stream Services Mon- Fri at Noon, and Sundays at 9:45AM**.

We all need to remember, while we are Staying Home, the financial life of Christ Church continues every day. It is more important than ever that we keep our contributions and pledges up to date. Remember to mail your contributions to Christ Church Forest Hill, PO Box 215, Forest Hill, MD 21050. To help facilitate that, Leslie Amtmann has made stamps and address stickers available to us all. I thank you in advance for your ongoing support until we can once again worship together in our historic Rock Spring Parish.

As you no doubt have seen already, life in the midst of the current public health crisis changes almost daily. Plans we had a week ago or ever a few days ago are no longer viable. The Holy Week schedule I have posted on our Face Book Page and at <a href="christchurchforesthill.org">christchurchforesthill.org</a> already needs revision with **Governor Hogan's most recent Stay Home order**.

Palm Sunday there will be no procession of cars in the lower lot to distribute palms as we previously had hoped. In fact, there will be no distribution of palms this year as person to person contact of any kind is too risky. So please, **Stay Home** and enjoy the following services on FaceBook or christchurchforesthill.org. So, Holy Week now looks like this:

- Palm Sunday, April 5, we will live-stream a service from Christ Church beginning at 9:45AM
- Maundy Thursday, April 9 we will live-stream the Stripping of the Altar and Prayers from Christ Church beginning at 7:00PM.
- Good Friday, April 10 we are invited to watch the service live-streamed from our Cathedral of the Incarnation, Baltimore. (Link will be on Website and Face Book on the day of)
- Holy Saturday, April 11 we are again invited to watch the service of The Great Vigil of Easter from the Cathedral. (Link will be on Facebook and Website the day of)
- Easter Morning, April 12 we will live-stream from Christ Church beginning at 9:45AM

A word about Live Stream Services: this requires a tremendous amount of bandwidth from your internet provider. Which in turn is often influenced on conditions with the provider, number of people online at a given time in your network, etc. If you experience difficulty with the Live service, sometimes you can wait for a few minutes and it will clear up. If not, once the service is over, it is available on both platforms, FaceBook and the Website, for at least 24 hours and you will find it will be much easier to view them once it is no longer Live. These, what are called "buffering," issues are

beyond our control. Very much like the virus itself, with the exception that Staying Home and Compassionate Distancing are two ways we can control the speed with which the virus spreads, which in turn does Save Lives.

And a word about the services themselves. I will continue to use forms of Daily Prayer from our Prayer Book. It is not appropriate to celebrate the Holy Eucharist alone in an otherwise empty church. Our traditions insist that there be at least two or three gathered together, which at this time is not safe. Additionally, I will continue to join with you in our unexpected long-term fasting from Communion until that day we can all return to our historic worship space together. Most often I will be using The Order of Service for Noonday. As we become familiar with this order I am hoping you will find it's an order that you can easily use for your daily prayers at home. This was the inspiration for the Book of Common Prayer back in 1549: that we all share common prayer services in our homes and in church. From time to time I will also use an adapted form of Morning Prayer. If you do not have a Book of Common Prayer, you may go online to download an electronic version from this link *Church Publishing*, which is also listed on our Face Book page and Website.

I will continue to provide an update of life together at Christ Church as I receive information from the Diocese and The Governor. We will continue to initiate the Parish Phone Tree once a week to Stay Connected. Together we will one day return to our historic church home for worship. That will be our true celebration of Resurrection. In the meantime, know that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is with us all to the end of the age, and most certainly in this current crisis. We are One in Christ as our Baptism proclaims!

### Christ Church Vestry Minutes February 29, 2020

Attendance: Lyn Edmunds, Dave Martell, Leslie Amtmann, Marianne Kidd, Molly Neal, Leigh Spicer, Lloyd Merriam, Kate Davis and Fr. Kirk.

The meeting began at 7:00 PM with centering prayer and a reflection on Matthew 17:1-9.

Minutes from the January meeting were approved. Minutes from the Annual meeting were approved, with one correction: the date for the Spaghetti Dinner should have said 2/15.

Treasurer's Report – The balance in the checking account is currently \$10,058, of which \$7,779 is reserved. We haven't had to withdraw from investments since last June and the T. Rowe Price account continues to have healthy growth.

Rector's Report – Fr. Kirk commented on how much he enjoys being part of our parish. There was a great turnout at the recent Annual Meeting, MapDash presentation and Spaghetti Dinner. Confirmation classes have begun (nickname for the group is "EpiscoPals"). Fr. Kirk repaired one toilet in the Annex and a door handle.

Senior Warden's Report – Molly reported the attendance at our spaghetti dinner was 108. It was a great success! Many from the community came and attributed that to our sign. We were asked about any tips to improve the event in the future – maybe having a welcoming committee. We are very grateful for the awesome help from volunteers through the ECW, Men's Group and Youth Group. Our next event sponsored by the ECW is the Ladies Teas on March 22<sup>nd</sup>. The theme is the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Women' Suffrage movement. Then there will be a rummage sale on 6/6. The ECW will be getting an electric stove for the kitchen.

Barbara Grabher has offered to take pictures of parish members to include in our next edition of the church directory. This project would need a leader to help coordinate things and research options.

Junior Warden's Report – Molly reached out to BGE about a couple of flood lights that needed fixing and they are now fixed. Molly's husband fixed a couple closet door handles that needed fixing and the light (dusk to dawn) outside the double doors of the Parish Hall that needed replacing.

An update regarding the last pieces of the old church organ — Phil Klein is planning to build a decorative side panel out of them in the back-right corner of the church.

Cemetery Committee Report – the final sone in need of repair since the car accident in September has been fixed. A contract for re-turfing the ground is on its way and we will get that work on the schedule for the Spring.

Old Business – a Vestry Oath for the new Vestry was presented and we all read it aloud and individually signed the oath.

The newly formed Audit Committee (Leigh Spicer, Dave Fender and Kate Davis) will begin meeting to start the process. Jason Kamrath, controller, from the diocese has offered to come up for our first meeting, if needed.

The MapDash presentation was very resourceful. There were 17 attendees in all, including members of several other small Episcopal churches in the area. Lyn provided us a summary of the highlights of the presentation. One bonus/consequence of this process is that the Parish Hall now has WiFi.

New Business – our ADP and some bank account representatives need to be updated from Leslie and Russ Guhr (since he has moved to FL). We voted/approved this would now be Leslie and Molly.

The Parish Hall rental is currently \$75/day + \$25 for use of kitchen. We discussed we would keep it the same. There will be a rental in June by an AA group, that Saturday after our rummage sale, and they asked what the cost would be. We could suggest if they want to make a donation, that would be acceptable, as we typically do not charge rent to AA groups.

We were presented with a draft copy of the 2019 Parochial Report for review. A motion to approve was made. We won't be getting financial assistance from the diocese this year. One thing we really need to look at is getting more pledge support. Our 2020 diocesan assessment is \$1,000/month.

The Diocesan Convention will be 5/15-5/16 this year. It is recommended that we have one representative from our church attend each year. Molly went last year and really enjoyed it. She offered to go again this year.

The next vestry meeting will be on March 25<sup>th</sup> at 7PM.

The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer, at 9:15PM.
