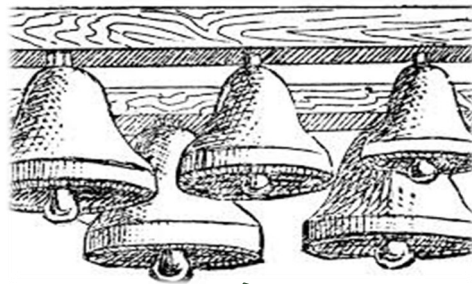

# Letter from the Pastor

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As of this writing, we have had two successful ReGathered Sundays in Church. Thanks to the faithful preparation of men and women of Christ Church, both services were concluded in just under 45 minutes, and everything went as well as can be given the restrictions and guidelines we follow in the Diocesan Phase Orange Covenant. I thank everyone who attended and everyone who made the preparations and who have helped out on our first two Holy Communion Sundays!

**We will continue to have Holy Communion with people in the church on the Second and Fourth Sunday of each month (October 13 & 27)** until we feel it is safe to add additional dates to our schedule. We still have a number of people who for reasons of self-care want to worship only via our Live Stream (which is every week), and the opportunity it affords to add singing to the service, which is currently prohibited when people are in church in Phase Orange.

I will be meeting with the Vestry by Zoom on Wednesday, October 7. If you have any questions or suggestions regarding our current worship schedule, feel free to communicate with one of them before that meeting. I will also begin discussions on how we will handle Thanksgiving and Christmas services this year given the likelihood we will continue to be in Phase Orange.

We continue to attract between 25-40 people to our *Live Stream Services on Sundays*, and anywhere from 10-20 most days for our **Monday thru Friday Noonday Prayer & More, which begins at 11:55am**. In the Noonday Prayer services during the week, we read “course readings” in various books of the Bible, taking our passages from the Book of Common Prayer’s Daily Lectionary for Year Two (BCP 934 ff). There is reflection on the theological meanings of the texts, as well as how they relate to life today. We follow with one or more Poems that usually have theological references as well. Following the readings, we take Five Minutes of Centering, or Contemplative Prayer before concluding our Prayers for the day. I highly encourage you to join us and the people from beyond Christ Church across the country who have made Noonday Prayer & More a regular part of their life in Christ!

I would never have guessed four years ago that at this stage of 2020 I would still be here, and that we would be having services six days a week! Though it has been a technological challenge and learning curve, the benefits of daily prayer far outweigh the work involved. Thanks to all of you who join us online several days a week, I feel that my prayer-life has been deepened along with my experience of the Living God in Christ – which after all is why we are a parish at all! That, and serving one another, and others beyond our life as Rock Spring Parish.

Finally, as we enter the late fall and winter months, our expenses will be increasing. Please remember to send your Pledges and Contributions to: Christ Church Forest Hill, P.O. Box 215, Forest Hill, MD 21050. Or, better still, bring it with you on a Second or Fourth Sunday when we have Holy Communion as a ReGathered Parish in the Diocese of Maryland!

# We Are... Those People Who are Part of a Larger Church

The Right Reverend William Burrill, retired Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, was a leader in Church Stewardship. He often reminded us that the Structure of The Episcopal Church had three dimensions: An International Church as part of the Anglican Communion, Dioceses, and Local Parishes. All three dimensions are part of what the current Presiding Bishop Michael Curry likes to call The Jesus Movement. Bill Burrill likened the Local Parish as something like a Fire Station is for a city or larger municipality: it is there to respond to the needs of the local area that it serves as those sent by Jesus Christ to serve others – all others. While the Diocese organizes the Local Parishes to be able to engage ministries beyond the local area and that would take resources most parishes are not able to muster. Similarly, The Episcopal Church (TEC) enables us to participate in ministries around the world, some of which are beyond the reach of both the Local Parish and the Diocese. We are all members incorporated in the Body of Christ, and are all simultaneously active and supporting members of not only a local parish, but also the Diocese and TEC!

Local Parishes have annual meetings to report on our local mission work, evaluate that work, and commit to further ministries as we feel called. Each Diocese in turn has an annual Diocesan Convention to similarly evaluate what we have been doing and chart new initiatives in living into the Kingdom of God Jesus urges us to be through his life, death and Resurrection as outlined in the Gospels, Paul's Letters, and all the books of the Old and New Testaments. Finally, The Episcopal Church meets every three years in General Convention to evaluate and chart the work we are all called to do nationally and internationally, since TEC has Dioceses far beyond the boundaries of the United States: in Central and South America, Asia, and Europe.

Here you will find the addresses from both of our bishops, reports, resolutions and all sorts of information about our Diocese and the work we all do as a part of the Diocese of Maryland.

Here you need to do a bit more digging around, but you can find the Blue Book of the 2018 General Convention which lists reports and resolutions, there is news about the upcoming 2021 General Convention which is supposed to be held in the Baltimore Convention Center, but may need to move to a Virtual Format.

A word about General Convention as I was a Deputy to Convention at the 2000 Convention in Denver. Like the US Government, there are two houses: The House of Deputies which is comprised of four clergy and four lay people from each Diocese, and the House of Bishops which is comprised of all active and some retired bishops. Any action of General Convention must pass both houses. There are committee meetings, amendments and all the familiar governing aspects we hear about in Washington DC. It is usually a Ten Day affair, and there is usually work to be taken back to the Diocese and Parishes.

We are all a part of all three Dimensions of The Episcopal Church, which enables us to send missionaries around the world, provide chaplains to hospitals and prisons, run feeding programs, and just about anything we can imagine Jesus wants us to do. We are part of a bigger Church, and for that we give thanks!

# Christ Church Vestry Minutes

August 5, 2020

[Virtual meeting via Zoom]

Attendance: Fr. Kirk, Lyn Edmunds, Lois Tidey, Molly Neal, Leigh Spicer, Laurie Morris, Leslie Amtmann, Marianne Kidd, Lynn Klein, Lloyd Merriam and Kate Davis.

The meeting began at 7:05 PM. Fr. Kirk read a passage from Matthew about the Feast of the Transfiguration, followed by contemplative silence.

The vestry minutes from our last meeting on July 8<sup>th</sup> were approved.

Rector's report – Baltimore city has put any in-person church services on hold again, due to rising positivity rates of the virus. Parish annual meetings will likely need to be virtual for the time being, until it is safe for large gatherings.

Our online services continue to grow in attendance, which is very encouraging.

Fr. Kirk is considering a vacation/break soon and will let us know when he has more details.

Sr. Warden's report – the ECW got together recently (following safety protocols) and celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment (granted women the right to vote).

Sanitization stations, which were purchased by the ECW, have now been installed.

Molly has been in touch with all AA groups. The Friday night group has returned to meetings on the patio only. The leaders are feeling very responsible for their groups and following guidelines.

The replacement part needed to fix the A/C chiller in the church has been ordered, but hasn't arrived, yet. We're not sure if it will be under warranty, but we will find out.

Jr. Warden's report – Molly received an update from Dave M. He and Mary Jane are working on some cleanup in the basement of the parish hall. The fluorescent lights in the music room have an issue with the ballast – Molly will see if Ed can fix it; otherwise, an electrician may be needed.

The new tentative plan for regathering is as follows:

8/29 – test run with the vestry at 10am

9/13 – first date to open the church for in-person service (communion will be served at end of service, on the way out). The service would need to be condensed/shortened to no more than 30 minutes. The service will also be livestreamed for anyone who chooses to attend virtually.

Then, going forward:

1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays of each month – livestream service only

2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of each month – in-person service + livestream option.

An idea was presented that perhaps we could incorporate liturgical dance into the in-person service, since there would be no singing allowed. It would certainly be worth exploring.

At 8:30pm, the meeting ended with an evening prayer from "Sounds of the Eternal" by John Philip Newell.

# Christ Church Vestry Minutes

September 16, 2020

[Virtual meeting via Zoom]

Attendance: Fr. Kirk, Lyn Edmunds, Lois Tidey, Molly Neal, Leigh Spicer, Laurie Morris, Leslie Amtmann, Marianne Kidd, Lloyd Merriam and Kate Davis.

The meeting began at 7:09 PM with contemplative prayer.

The vestry minutes from our last meeting on August 5<sup>th</sup> were approved.

Treasurer's report – the balance in the checking account is currently \$7,971, of which \$6,218 is reserved. We have paid back 56% of the chiller loan, so far. The treasurer's report was approved.

Cemetery Committee report – we had a recent inquiry about a potential burial coming up.

Rector's report – on Saturday, 9/12, the first virtual Diocesan convention was held and it was very efficient/productive. Each bishop gave an address and 6 resolutions were discussed. One major resolution that passed was for funding toward race reparations. The diocese is encouraging all parishes to explore our own church's history as it relates to racial relations. The TedTalk by Ericcka Bridgeford (who founded and helps organize Baltimore's Ceasefire weekends) is a highly recommended resource.

Our first in-person service/re-gathering since the pandemic began was on Sunday, 9/13. It went very smoothly. We will continue this option twice a month (on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays). A few takeaways/suggestions for going forward are as follows:

- Move offering plate to beside back table.
- Communion will be distributed by Fr. Kirk at the end of the center aisle, rather than closer to the exit door.
- Sign-in book will be moved to the Narthex, so incoming parishioners can receive an overview of procedures from greeter in a quieter space so as not to disturb service.
- Have someone ring church bell before service begins.
- Molly has asked the Men's group to help with managing the Rota for ushers/greeters. Lyn E. also offered to help be part of the pool of ushers.

Sr. Warden's report – the Saturday AA group is back and meeting inside with 6-ft. spacing between seats. Other groups are also starting to regather. The aerobics group is in the process of submitting plans to regather. The Peacemakers quilting group is back on Tuesday mornings. Windows are kept open during meetings. We need to follow-up with Scott Slater at the diocese regarding the protocol for colder months when the heat will be on and windows can't be kept open.

An idea was presented to make it clear where to send donations (the PO Box address), especially for online viewers of the service, since we don't have an online donation link at this time. Fr. Kirk will look into adding this to our Facebook live link, as well as including it in the weekly bulletin.

The next meeting will be on 10/7.

At 8:45pm, the meeting ended with a closing prayer.

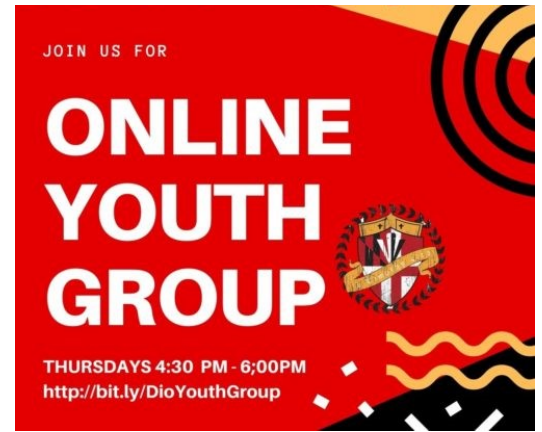

### **Covenant for Regathering**

In response to the current COVID-19 pandemic, I promise, with God's help and to the best of my ability, to abide by the guidelines of the Diocese of Maryland for participation in the life of my congregation according to the regathering phase in which my congregation is authorized to carry out its mission and ministry.

In fulfillment of the Baptismal Covenant (*BCP* p. 304-305), I will strive to:

Love my neighbor as myself, I will...

- Wear a mask or scarf over my nose and mouth at all times in church buildings, except momentarily to receive the sacrament or lead worship through an assigned speaking part, and follow public health guidelines for hand sanitizing and disinfecting
- Only attend worship and receive communion if I am non-symptomatic for the COVID-19 virus or any other transmittable disease that could compromise the health of another congregant
- Will abstain from attending if doing so would put me at greater risk due to my own health status

Respect the dignity of every human being, I will...

- Make no physical contact with people beyond the members of my own household
- Maintain a six foot or more distance from other members of the congregation
- Respect any requests for distance, masking, and cleaning, to ensure the safety and comfort level of others

Seek and serve Christ in all people...

- Trust and support the decisions of both my diocesan and congregational leaders
- Stay connected with others in my community by telephone, video chat, or mail
