

## Letter From The Rector

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Looking back at last years at this time, we are fortunate to be offering in-church Worship every Sunday right now. Those who have been coming each week can confirm that we are make incremental changes that begin to look like church as we once knew it before the Pandemic set in. That is, with some changes that will continue to be a part of the future of Christ Church: a camera, lights and a computer sending our Sunday services literally to people across the country and around the world. Most importantly, parishioners still not comfortable worshipping in public can still view our services from the privacy of their own home.

Another way that we have found to Stay Church is our daily Live Streamed Noonday Prayer Monday through Friday. This approximately half-hour includes Bible Study, Sacred Poetry, as well as intercessory prayer and time set aside for contemplative or silent prayer. This knew way to study and pray together also allows "newcomers" and friends and family from around the world to join us whenever circumstances allow.

Also, during the Pandemic, we have repaid all but approximately \$3,000.00 of what we borrowed from the Cemetery Fund to replace the Chiller that cools the church in the summer months. A remarkable example of what we are capable of achieving once we set a goal for ourselves. This is in addition to our Pledges and Sunday offerings which have enabled us to keep the doors open not only for our own Worship, but to open our doors to others from all over the Harford County region to participate in Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, and to stay in shape through Jazzercize and Aerobics classes in the Parish Hall. Thanks to personal efforts of individuals in our parish, we know have a Little Free Library and Food Pantry available to all 24/7, and a new Cross on the front rooftop of the church.

In the five years I have been here as your Priest-in-Charge, we have had grants from the Diocese of Maryland and Local County Grants to help us stabilize our financial situation, as well as reduce our Annual Pledge to the Diocese almost in half of what it had been six years ago.

Now it is time to secure our future. Fall is the traditional time of year to secure pledges for the year ahead. There is no telling what the challenges will be in 2022, nor can we even imagine other new directions we may be able to go to serve God's people here in Harford County. What we do know is that there will be increased fuel and electric bills with increased operation of our buildings, not to mention the rising costs of goods and services.

Each of us will soon receive a mailing asking us to make a Pledge for the Future of Christ Church Forest Hill, Rock Spring Parish. Look through recent issues of The Chimes and you will see we still do not have weekly and monthly income to pay all our bills and support the greater mission of the Episcopal Church. Consider what Christ Church means to you and your family as you fill out a pledge for 2022. As things beyond our control, like the Pandemic, work themselves out, let us join together to Secure the Future of Christ Church with a pledge from each household for 2022. Our Lord call us to follow him in living our life together as active participants of His Father's Kingdom of love and forgiveness for all persons, no matter what.

Thank you for your ongoing prayers and support for Christ Church! Together we are making a difference in the lives of others, both here and around the world.



# Christ Church vestry Minutes September 15, 2021 [Virtual meeting via Zoom]

Attendance: Fr. Kirk, Lyn Edmunds, Lois Tidey, Molly Neal, Laurie Morris, Lloyd Merriam and Kate Davis.

Meeting began at 7:05 PM with opening prayer.

The Vestry minutes from the last meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Balance in our checking account is currently \$22,744. However, \$15,088 is reserved and \$10,000 is from memorial gifts, so we are in the red by \$2,344. Our pledge income and hall rentals are not sufficient to meet our expenses. Leslie will transfer \$4,000 of the reserved Warm Hearts Cool Worship fund to the Cemetery account. At the end of the summer is when we are typically billed for Cemetery maintenance. As of the end of August, we have only \$3,502 left to pay off the chiller (WHCW) debt.

Molly mentioned that Leslie will be putting together a spreadsheet to keep track of gifts and when those donations are applied to expenses. Until we decide how to spend the recent memorial gifts, a portion of each will be moved into our T. Rowe Price account.

Cemetery Committee report – Fr. Kirk conducted a graveside service for the family of Vera Dalby whose cremains were interred on Thursday, September  $9^{th}$ .

Rector's report – Fr. Kirk sent the Vestry a copy of a Vaccine Directive from the Bishops of Maryland that will soon be forwarded to the congregation. It was also pointed out that there is an online vaccine registry (<a href="https://myirmobile.com/">https://myirmobile.com/</a>) where you may download a copy of your vaccination records, which is helpful if you've lost your COVID vaccine card.

We received an estimate for installing a UV light/sanitization unit in the Annex air handlers (neutralizes viruses and germs that go through the handler) of just under \$3,000. The unit can be programmed so the light comes on at certain times to extend its life. Eventually, we would need to replace the bulb. A motion was made and approved to apply part of the COVID-relief grant from Harford County toward this project. Once the Annex is used for music lessons again, it was recommended that instrument mitigation be put in place for wind instruments – there are masks that cover the end of wind instruments called bell covers.

Sr. Warden's report – there was a recent computer glitch in the office and Chad LaFleur was able to help fix the issue (related to storage/protection of data). And external drive was recommended (minimal cost). We discussed whether to keep the band stand/stage that's on the lawn by the front of the church. Since it's not completely deteriorated, it was suggested we keep it in place for now.

The invoice for installing the new cross on top of the church hasn't arrived, yet. We previously voted to use the memorial gift from the Rigdon family toward the cost of this project. We would like to plan a ceremony/dedication of the new cross and invite the Rigdons as well as Phil & Lynne Klein (who built the new cross). This is tentatively planned for Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, after church.

Jr. Warden's report – Molly received an update from Dave M. that the Crepe Myrtle trees outside the Parish Hall are not causing any structural damage to the building. He will prune them heavily and has been doing a lot of work in the garden beds lately. Dave received quotes on a few items in need of fixing:

- \* Fascia on Parish Hall = \$375
- Fascia on Annex = \$175
- \* Repair of slate on roof snow break = \$400
- \* Paint louvres in bell tower (labor and paint) = \$3500

We voted to approve the first 3 items above and will use funds from the Cemetery account. The painting job will be discussed at a future meeting.

Lois announced that the Peace Makers Quilting group has ceremony planned for Alice Richardson (Debbie Senes' sister) to thank her for all her support over the years. It will be on 9/16 at 2:30pm, outside the Parish Hall, if anyone would like to attend.

The next meeting will be on 10/20 at 7:00pm.

At 8:12 pm, the meeting ended with a closing prayer and blessing.

#### WHAT'S SUE BEEN DOING IN FLORIDA?

What a pleasure it was to see one of our long time friends from Florida visiting us this Fall. Sue Sampson has been one of our greatest supporters (and a former ECW President) and friend for years and it was so nice to see her again in person! She continues to keep up with our church events and supports many of our projects from afar. I kind of interviewed her after church a couple of Sundays ago and found out more about a group she has joined in Florida.

She explained that she is a member of the Order of the Daughters of the King (aka "DOK"). She had to undergo training to be a member and earn the privilege to wear the cross that she was wearing. She agreed to let me write up a little of the information about the group. There are dozens of groups throughout Florida. The Order of the Daughters of the King is an International Order for women who are communicants of the Episcopal Church, churches in communion with it, or churches in the historic episcopate such as the Lutheran (ELCA) and Roman Catholic churches. (Found on the internet) It is an Anglican lay religious order for women founded in New York in the 19th century which continues today.

Sue says she mainly prays for and with those in need. She loves the spiritual growth as well as the fellowship. I also discovered that a member of the DOK reaffirms the promises made at Baptism and Confirmation and pledges herself to a life-long program of prayer, service and evangelism. She receives support from a worldwide community of like-minded women.

All daughters make the same promises upon their admission to the Order: To Obey the two Rules of the Order: the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service. To Offer at all times loyal aid to our clergy and parish to spread Christ's kingdom. To wear faithfully the cross of The Order. To work for the purposes of The Order as God may give us the opportunity. Each Daughter is unique, and everyone has her own job to do. Some members will be very visible, while others quietly carry out the work that God has called them to do. As Daughters of the King, each are called to be on a common mission of spreading the good news of King Jesus prayerfully in word and deed. The one Order is as diverse as the states and countries that members reside in.

Sue and her Grandson Jacob are loving Florida. They would love to hear from us and if anyone is near them in Florida – please give her a call and drop in for a visit. She also left us with a message to take time to check-in with a friend or loved one and let them know you are thinking of them and give them the encouragement they may need.

It was so wonderful to get to visit with Sue and learn about this organization that I had never heard of before. I can't wait to see how many Orders are in Maryland.

As well as Dad, Uncle, and big brother Drew who served in Law enforcement.

Kincaid and Jacob spent years serving our Church as Acolytes. We returned home in 2008 at which time Kincaid trained as an Acolyte and then he passed the torch to Jacob. They followed the footstep of their big brother who served as an Acolyte at each Church that became our home while moving in the military. And of course their father Robert Lane who grew up in Christ Church, much like his Mom, and served as an Acolyte under Reverend Eads.

Upon completion of military occupational school he will return home as a Reservist while he pursues his education in air craft mechanics and possibly mechanical engineering here

Kincaid Lane earning his Airmen wings on 4 Nov when he graduated Air Force Basic Military Training. From there he heads to his technical school for munitions systems, getting to put to use some of his education in Mechanical/Electrical engineering technologies. He will then go on to a duty station yet to be determined. His plan is to finish his last 20–30 college credits while active duty with the intent to apply to become an officer in Air Force or Space Force, when his time comes to reenlist. Kincaid at the moment, is planning a 20 year AF career, looking to move into propulsion engine work and has
