Dear Friends,

I think our congregational conversations between the services each week are going well. We are exploring, little by little, our memories, feelings, hopes, and dreams for Holy Trinity. These weekly conversations allow us to explore these topics together, as a community, and thus to strengthen the bonds within Holy Trinity.

If you are not able to be present for these conversations, you can still participate: you can email or text me your thoughts on each week's topic, and I'll add your input to an expanded narrative of the discussion.

In addition to these important conversations on Sundays, I would like to offer a Soup and Study on three Thursdays in Advent (Dec. 5, 12, and 19). This would give us an opportunity to focus on our spiritual lives as we approach Christmas. Each session would consist of eating together (a simple meal of soup and bread), followed by 30-45 minutes of study and discussion. You can help me plan for that by answering two questions:

1. Would you attend and participate on those dates if the Soup and Study were offered
 - a. at noon, or
 - b. at 5:30 p.m.
2. Which of the following topics of study would you prefer:
 - a. overview of the Bible
 - b. exploring the Sacraments
 - c. exploring the seasons of the church year

If you are interested in the Advent Soup and Study, please call the office and answer those two questions. You can leave your answers on the voicemail, or call when Leah is in and tell her your preferences.

Advent is a good time to focus our spiritual lives, so I hope you will be able to participate in the Soup and Study. And in the meantime, see you in church!

FROM THE DEACON'S BENCH

Dear Friends in Christ,

Prayer is one of the most important parts of our relationship with God. It is a way to express our innermost thoughts and desires. It is a time we intentionally set aside to spend with God; to go to our own private place and speak in our own words.

Martin Luther said of prayer:

Guard yourself carefully against those false, deluding ideas which tell you, "Wait a little while. I will pray in an hour; first I must attend to this or that." Such thoughts get you away from prayer into other affairs which so

hold your attention and involve you that nothing comes of prayer for that day. . . .

We must be careful not to break the habit of true prayer and imagine other works to be necessary which, after all, are nothing of the kind.

We all sometimes get lost in the busy lives we lead, which means we need to get our priorities in check; setting aside time for prayer should be top on our list.

Each of us has the ability to spare 15 minutes each day to be in relationship with

God. And as you begin to do this, you will find God talking back to you, maybe in a thought during the day, maybe in the words you say to a friend or the actions you take when helping a stranger. As you become more comfortable in your prayer routine, you will find you actually crave that time—that time alone with God, because when you finish, you will feel a wonderful sense of peace and contentment. We are quickly approaching Advent, the busiest of times, start setting aside your time with God now, so that you may find yourselves grounded during Advent and truly experience the peace of God that surpasses all understanding.

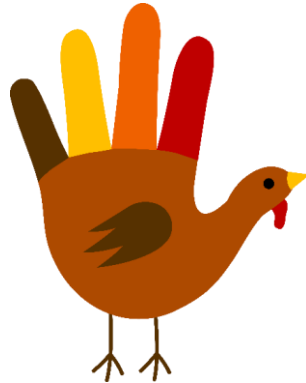
Messages
