Parish Finances-Update

Holy Trinity's income seems to be dwindling, which is not a good thing. If you have been sending in your pledge regularly, *thank you!* If you haven't, please start. We have a brand new *locking* mailbox, so you need not fear that someone might snatch your pledge or offering on its way to us. Only the postal carrier and the Holy Trinity staff have access to the mailbox.

We do urge all of you to keep up with your pledge payments – either by sending checks or by using the online portal on the diocesan website. A number of you have begun to pay your pledge once a month, which is very helpful.

Please put your check in your church envelope inside your mailing envelope. Also, write your name and the amount on the church envelope. This helps the tellers who are counting and recording the pledge payments.

LOCAL FOOD PANTRY

Due to Coronavirus concerns, the Eastern Interfaith Outreach (EIO) Food Pantry is currently closed. However, there is another local food pantry available at St. Clare Catholic Church located at 714 Myrth Avenue in Essex. They are open on Tuesdays from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon for people to drop off donations or to pick up food items if in need. Those receiving aid must bring ID showing that they are residents of either the 21220 or 21221 ZIP code.

When arriving at St. Clare's, enter the parking lot on the fire station side, go past the steps, to back of the school. The doors are right around the corner on that end of the building. Drop off and pick up of food items will be done outside of those doors.

If you are donating, St Clare's could use the following: Instant Mashed Potatoes, Small Boxes of Pancake Mix, Syrup (small), Any

Canned Vegetables, Canned Meats (tuna, chicken, spam), Ramen/Cup of Noodle Soups.

Please do not leave the food at any times other than Tuesday between 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon. There is no one at the church to take the food at other times.

In addition, on Monday evenings between 4:00-6:00 p.m., St. Clare's will be distributing \$5 McDonald's gift cards to those in need.

Please share this information with your friends, family, and neighbors in case anyone needs food at this time. Thank you.
