FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

How are you?

A simple question, but one that resonates with us all nowadays. How are we? Are we confused, and tired, and anxious? Are we stubborn and angry? Are we sad and longing for things to be normal again? Are we wondering if we even know what "normal" means? Or are we full of eagerness and joy, ready to tackle new adventures, excited and impatient to see what will happen next?

Have you ever noticed that if you ask Deacon Cindy how she is, she almost always answers, "I'm a ray of sunshine."

So I have a challenge for you. When you feel anxious or angry or sad or depressed, don't dwell on how *you're* feeling, but go and find someone else (in person, by phone, by text) and ask, "How are you?" Really

listen to their reply, and if they are having negative feelings, say something simple like, "I'm sorry. How can I help?" and then *think of yourself as a ray of sunshine*. Imagine that there's a grey cloud around the other person, but your ray of sunshine is so strong that it dries up the cloud.

That little exercise has two benefits: it really does help the other person, through your empathy, and it really does help *you* to regain a more positive outlook. It's a way of loving a neighbor as we love ourselves. It's a way of seeking and serving Christ in others. It's a way of proclaiming by example the Good News of God in Christ. And it can even be part of an enjoyable conversation.

Sign Up Genius Instructions

We are using a new computer program to assist us with keeping track of who signs up for each church service. This is necessary because we can only have 40% occupancy in the church at any one time.

Please note that, although the sign-up software says you are only signing up for the first Sunday of the month, you will actually be signed up for ALL of the Sundays in that month. We made that decision in order to minimize the time spent on scheduling. It is okay if you sign up but are not able to attend every Sunday.

To sign up by computer:

- 1. Type the following address into your Internet browser: https://www.signupgenius.com/findasignup
- 2. Under "Search for a sign up" type the following email address: HTOfficeSecretary@gmail.com
- 3. Click the "Search" button
- 4. Click on the "HT Church Services _____ 2020" item (choose the appropriate month)
- 5. Choose either the 8:00 or 10:00 service by clicking on the appropriate blue "Sign Up" button.
- 6. Click the blue "Submit and Sign Up" button at the bottom of the page.
- 7. Type your name(s) in the "Comment" line and the number of people in your immediate family who will be coming, including yourself.
- 8. Follow all of the remaining prompts until you are notified that you have successfully signed up for the service time that you want.

Please note: The software will <u>not</u> let you sign up if all of the spaces have been taken at that time. If this happens, call the church office on Tuesday or Thursday between 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon to notify Leah. We want to know if there are any parishioners who have not been able to sign up so we know if we need to consider adding a third service.

If you cannot sign up via the Internet:

Call Leah during church office hours only! The church office hours are Tuesday and Thursday 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon. The church telephone number is 410-687-5531. You must speak to Leah directly. Messages left on the answering machine will not get you signed up for the service. Please do not call Leah at home; she cannot sign you up from her house.
