Warden's Report



I have been serving as Senior Warden since May of 2017 when Janet Dettwiler needed to step down because of Bill's ongoing health issues. It has been both a challenge and a pleasure to serve in this capacity for the past three-and-a-half years. I will step down when your new Senior Warden begins to serve at the conclusion of the Annual Parish Meeting on January 17, 2021.

I am delighted with all the property issues that have been successfully addressed during this time, and especially grateful to Jerry Wolff who has guided them. Among the many issues addressed are included: a basement that no longer floods every time it rains, a new septic system, a church washed and sealed externally against moisture and repaired internally from fallen plaster and repainted.

I am also grateful to Liz Pratt and all her committee members who completed an evaluation of the physical conditions of the church, parish house, and grounds so we will know what to expect for future upkeep of our properties. Liz also compiled notebooks with detailed

information on all of the items evaluated in the survey. These are available in the office for reference with regard to maintenance and repairs. Still to be addressed is the issue of how to meet these property expenses since they greatly exceed our annual operating budget.

The biggest challenge of all arrived this year with the pandemic which led to cancellation of in person services in the church. For years we had discussed our desire for live streaming, particularly to have expanded space for services to reach the Parish House when overflow crowds could not be accommodated within the church. The pandemic required immediate action, not for overflow crowds, but to make the services available to all members who could no longer safely attend indoor services. Our former organist, Joe Fetters, has been a gift from the Almighty as he counselled us on what would be needed, and gave of both his time and equipment to help it happen. We are grateful to Kerry Kittle who through her son was able to provide us with the essential video camera. We appreciate our volunteers who learned how to operate the equipment: Liz Pratt, Carl Owens, Nancy Ann Sayre and our volunteers who managed the ushering during the brief period that we were able to have limited in person attendance: Jean Bloyer, Pete and Gerri Huryk, Walt Rowe, Penny Schmidt, Nancy Ann Sayre, Jean Wilson.

We are most fortunate to have the leadership of our priest, Fr. Joe+, who is seeing us through this difficult time so different from what he had anticipated when he accepted our call to serve as our rector early in 2019. And we are equally blessed to have our extremely competent and engaged Parish Administrator, Jennifer Contino, who has been working tirelessly on all manner of projects including a new and improved Website and updated Facebook presence.

The greatest pleasure for me has been the way that all of you have been willing to step up to the plate to offer your services as they are needed. That is the strength of this beautiful and blessed congregation.

All Saints Fund



Parishioners new to the congregation of Holy Trinity Church may have questions about some of the capital accounts, one of which is the All Saints Fund. This fund was established to receive memorial contributions after the death of a loved one. The current balance in the account is \$17,597.06. The fund is contained in two certificates of deposit (CDs) and deposits in the money market account found on the back page of the monthly treasurer's report.

When a contribution to this fund is made by a non-family member, the parish administrator notifies the family of the deceased in the event that the family wants to send a thank-you note.

The money in this account is used for special purchases outside the normal operating budget. For instance, the money might be used for new prayer books and hymnals to replace worn ones. The fund has also been used to purchase a special stole.

The All Saints Fund should not be confused with the Endowment Fund. The latter is a depository for gifts from individuals, either while they are living or as directed by their wills. Income generated by this fund in the form of interest and dividends has been used to supplement the operating budget in years past. Fortunately, for the past several years the pledged income has been large enough so that money from the Endowment Fund has not been needed to balance the budget.
