

From the Rector

All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. (John 1:3-5 NRSV)

The Advent wreath, common in many Christian communities during the season of Advent, is a symbolic representation of two important aspects of this season. The first is it acts for us as a countdown or a calendar, inviting us to prepare ourselves to receive the coming of Christ. Each Sunday that we light a new candle we mark our progress on the journey towards Christmas, the day on which we celebrate Christ's first coming into the world. This marking of time also reminds us to prepare our hearts and souls for Christ's second coming. The second aspect is the symbolism of the increasing light. As the candles are illuminated one after the other from week to week, concluding with the center white candle which represents Christ, we observe how the growing light shines to overcome the darkness in this world.

These two symbolic actions of the wreath have their origins in Germany, when in 1839 a Protestant pastor and urban missioner of the poor by the name of Johann Hinrich Wichern constructed the first out of a ring of wood with nineteen small

red tapers and four larger white candles for the children he taught. Each day a small candle was lit and each Sunday a large candle. Today's Advent wreath is a pared-down version of the first retaining only the four large candles.

For nearly two hundred years, the Advent wreath has called us to prepare and to rejoice. Prepare ourselves to receive God's incredible gift of love that redeems and, saves us and to be glad with incredible joy for such love. So may this season of preparation bring you much joy in God's love found in the light that is Jesus Christ.
